PRIVACY NOTICE RELATING TO PUPIL INFORMATION

What is the purpose of this Notice?

This is the Pupil Privacy Notice of Avanti Schools Trust which is intended to provide you with information about

- To support children with medical conditions, allergies, and SEN
- To manage admissions
- To monitor attendance
- To manage exclusions and behaviour
- For assessment and examination purposes
- For health and safety purposes
- To address safeguarding concerns
- To promote the school and celebrate educational achievement
- To ensure that the school is safe and secure
- To allow cashless payments to be made
- To provide careers advice and support

Why is it lawful to collect this pupil information?

As a MAT, we are subject to a wide range of laws which we must comply with to further pupil education and to safeguard their wellbeing. To comply with these laws, we only process personal information as far as is necessary to meet those obligations. We also process some of the information described in this privacy notice to carry out public tasks vested in us to effectively manage the MAT.

Youth support services

Pupils aged 13+

Once our pupils reach the age of 13, we also pass pupil information to our local authority and / or provider of youth support services as they have responsibilities in relation to the education or training of 13

The Department for Education

The Department for Education (DfE) collects personal data from educational settings and local authorities via various statutory data collections. We are required to share information with the Department for Education (DfE) either directly or via our local authority for the purpose of those data collections, under:

All data is transferred securely and held by DfE under a combination of software and hardware controls, which meet the current government security policy framework.
